

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This one-day of continuing medical education course is designed to provide healthcare providers practicing in gastroenterology and hepatology an opportunity to learn about and discuss the advances in the diagnosis and treatment of patients with portal hypertension (PHTN). This course will provide sessions that will focus on the pathophysiology of PHTN and its complication including ascites hepatic hydrothorax, hepatic encephalopathy, and the different modalities of managing esophageal and gastric varices.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this CME activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe PHTN as an emerging epidemic with major health consequences
- Discuss ascites and hepatic hydrothorax treatment
- Treat hepatic encephalopathy using the most current therapy
- Utilize the endoscopic and radiologic approaches to patients with gastric varices
- Integrate different approaches to the management of esophageal varices including endoscopic, radiologic and surgical options
- Demonstrate the TIPS and BRTO strategies in patients with gastric varices

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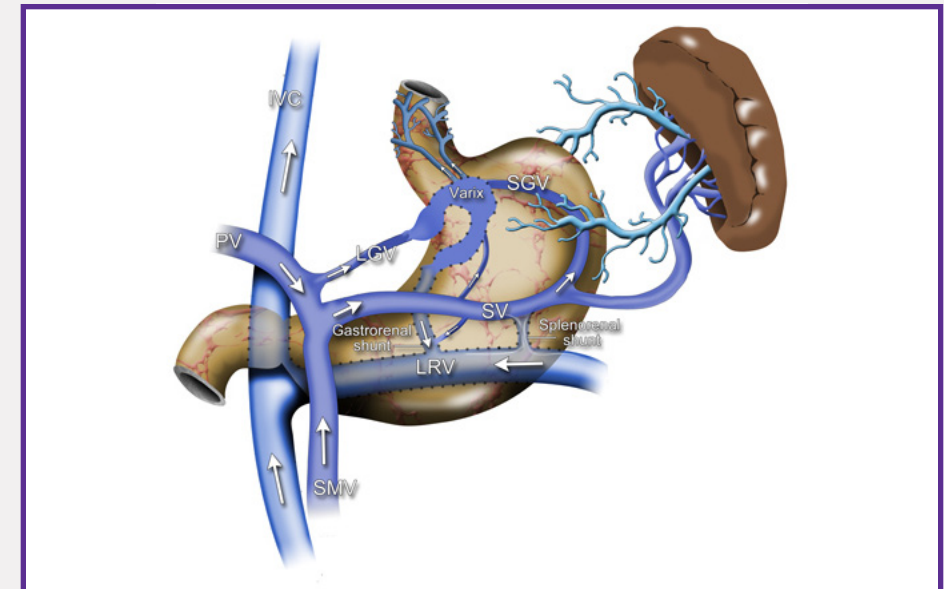
